

LAST SEM'S AIDE TES grantees receive first half of subsidy

At least 1,724 students of Eastern Visayas State University-Main Campus already received half of the Php 40,000.00 Tertiary Education Subsidy (TES) cash grant last January to cover the first semester's allocation.

According to the Head of Student Affairs Office (SAO), Prof. Sonia T. Enrile, TES is a subvention given to the poorest among the poor which aims to help students who are in need of financial support especially those belonging in a marginalized family.

"I am very thankful na naupod ako han TES kay waray la hiya makabulig ha akon pag iskwela pati gihap ha akon family kay dire na gud ako/kami magkukuri hin duro pamiling hin kwarta para tak mga paraliton ngan baraydan ha school like books. This is really a blessing," said Kenneth

Enrolment stat declines by 11% for second semester

Office of the University Registrar revealed a decrease in the number of enrollees for the second semester from 10,961 officially enrolled students last semester down to 9,852 as of January 31 despite the effectuation of the Tertiary Education Subsidy (TES).

Said number of enrollees from the first semester did not continuously increase even after the release of the cash grants last December under the core program of the RA 10931 or the

Universal Quality Tertiary Education Act.

New appointed head of the University Registrar, Prof. Judith B Campo believes that the root cause of such decrease in the student population is due to reported drop-outs, other personal reasons or priorities such as engaging into a job or venturing into a micro-business.

Meanwhile, the registrar's office tallied a total of 2,301 students from the College of Engineering (COE), 1,431 students from the College of Technology (COT), 1,415 students from

SUCs face-off in EVCAA Basketball Tourney Season 1

Set to supplement the basketball arena laid out by the annual SCUAA Meet, Tingog Sinirangan and Leyte First District put up the first season of the Eastern Visayas Collegiate Athletics Association (EVCAA) Games with eight State Universities and Colleges vying for the golden cup.

According to Mr. Julius Ross Lacaba, EVCAA's Tournament Commissioner, the first season of this basketball tournament aims to improve the level of competition among basketball players in the region, to help the national team select potential players and to provide capacity-building to referees and coaches.

"We are supporting the national agenda on grassroots sports development with the vision that we will be able to produce players who will compete in the national and international basketball tournaments," Lacaba said in an article from SunStar Philippines.

Mr. Lacaba emphasized that EVCAA's main goal is to not only let the student-athletes showcase their talents in sport but also to improve.

"There is no other way to make good basketball players than to make them play. We make them play, we play better, better tactics and

strategies, and eventually you create a better team," Jude Acidre, second nominee of the said party-list said in the same article from SunStar Philippines.

First Games

University of Eastern Philippines (UEP) beat the Northwest Samar State University (NwSSU) during the first game under the Eastern Conference while Eastern Visayas State University (EVSU) made a good start after defeating Leyte Normal University with a 10-point lead, 72-62 during the second game under the

Western Conference.

Meanwhile, Eastern Samar State University (ESSU) and Samar State University (SSU) will face-off for the Eastern Conference, also Naval State University (NSU) and Visayas State University (VSU) for the western conference on February 9-10 at the Tacloban City Convention Center.

"Training, discipline, hard work, proper work ethics, chemistry, friendship and camaraderie are the things that we possessed. We won because we have proper training and we trusted each other," said Prof. Sheldon Ives Go Agaton, coach of EVSU Eagles.

Team captain of EVSU Eagles, Raffy Gravador was hailed "Player of the Game" after earning 19 points, 3 blocks and 12 rebounds.

"I'm so proud of myself but I'm way more proud to the team because without them, I would not earn the title," Gravador said.

Said basketball tournament will resume for 7-8 weeks for the elimination round and 3-4 weeks for the playoffs and final round.

Ms. Angel Rose Tambal, EVSU's Ms. Sports, was crowned as the first ever Ms. EVCAA. •

"All students that were enrolled here in the university were submitted to the TES portal. Gin submit kamo tanan except la han mga Marine students because their course is not yet recognized by CHED. Waray requirements na kinahanglan. All names of

Sen. Bam Aquino talks on FHE, TES

As the principal sponsor and co-author of R.A. 10931 or the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act, Senator Bam Aquino made his visit to Eastern Visayas State University (EVSU) for his #LibreNaKolehiyo caravan last January 24 at the EVSU Auditorium.

“For those who have known nothing but disappointment, we need to be that voice of confidence. For those who are paralyzed by their failures, we can be that voice of inspiration,” said Aquino on encouraging the students to fight for their right to education.

According to the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), the Tertiary Education Subsidy (TES) as one of the core programs under the Republic Act No. 10931 also known as the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act, has an allocation of Php16 Billion from the Php40 Billion budget which is a grants-in-aid program that provides funding for all Filipino students from the poorest-of-the-poor households enrolled in public and private HEIs.

Part of the said law is to give Student Grants and Financial Loans to both public and private tertiary education institutions or students enrolled in State

Universities and Colleges (SUCs), Local Universities and Colleges (LUCs) and Government-Owned TechVoc Institution.

However, questions as to how the selection of the grantees for the said program were raised during the forum.

Head of the Student Affairs Office, Prof. Sonia T. Enrile clarified that everyone who qualified for the FHE program were submitted for the TES evaluation.

“Only the CHED has the power to select the beneficiaries in consideration of the standards they set for this subsidy,” Prof. Enrile said.

Two-time student regent, Hon. Jobert F. Briones shared his story on how difficult college is in terms of financial matters.

“Laking ginhawa para sa kinabuhay nang naisabatas ang free higher education law dahil imbes na pambayad ng matrikula, nailalaan ko na ang pera sa ibang mga bagay at sa mga pangangailangan ng aking mga kapatid. Dahil sa batas para sa libreng kolehiyo, mas marami nang mga estudyante ang nagkaroon ng interes na magpatuloy at magtapos ng kanilang pag-aaral.”

Other than EVSU, Sen. Aquino will visit other university in the Philippines as part of this education caravan. •

by the Supreme Student Government to encourage students to engage in healthy competition since last school year as part of the Founding Anniversary Celebration.

the College of Business and Entrepreneurship (COBE), 1,400 students from College of Education (COED), 1,171 students from the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), 471 students from the College of Architecture and Allied Discipline (CAAD),

1,155 students from the Graduate School (GS) and 500 students from the Science Laboratory Department (SLD).

However, some of the colleges resulted to an addition in number due to students who shifted from one program to another.

“Though the VPAA said

that we will not be accepting shiftees this semester, hindi talaga maiwasang mayroong shiftees, wala tayong magagawa kundi tanggapin,” Prof. Campo added.

Classes for the second semester officially started last January 11 and the enrolment process was

extended until the first week of February to accommodate students who still lack grades from the previous semester. •

BEYOND THY DEFINITION

Language is a tool towards unity but thinking beyond from it is another part of the story.

All of us have our own preferences when it comes to language. The kind of language that do not limit our thoughts, our opinions, and of course ourselves. ENGLISH AS A LANGUAGE.

ENGLISH AS AN ASSET.



Fell frailly


Winter turned spring
